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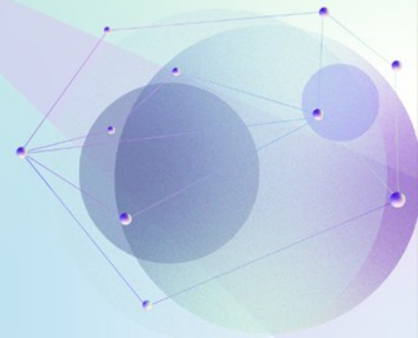


# The power of health data - *and the need for more robust governance*

## A global and regional Health Data Governance Framework

### **BUILDING COUNTRY CONSENSUS AND COMMITMENT**

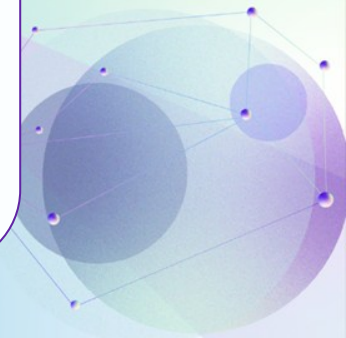
A global standard for health data governance and essential areas that should be addressed through national legislation - *based on countries experiences and good practice.*

### **ESTABLISHING COMPATIBILITY IN NATIONAL APPROACHES**

Establishing a level of compatibility in national approaches to foster greater legal coherence across jurisdictions, which is important for cross-border data sharing.

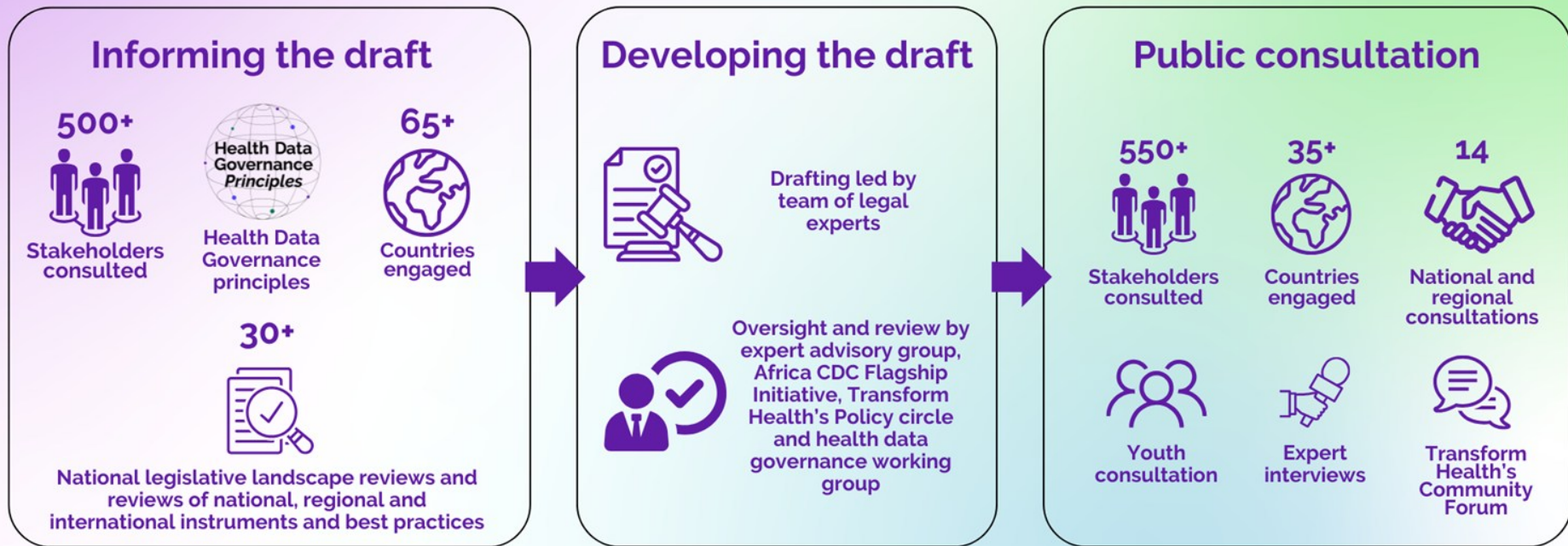
### **A RESOURCES TO SUPPORT NATIONAL EFFORTS**

Providing a blueprint and flexible framework that governments can use as a resource to strengthen national approaches.

# Aims and overview of the Model Law



[healthdatagovernance.org/modellaw](https://healthdatagovernance.org/modellaw)

- Contains core elements, legislative guidance and reference legal text
- Blueprint and flexible framework - not prescriptive or imposing
- Strikes balance between protection of personal and community health data & facilitation of its use for public benefit
- Facilitates data use as a force for good
- Principles of equity, justice, and respect for human rights
- Addresses challenges/opportunities of emerging technologies
- Harmonised approach while respecting diverse legal, cultural, and societal contexts
- Assumes existence of a national data protection law



# Government leadership and action

We encourage governments to

## Take Action on Health Data Governance

### CHAMPION THE DEVELOPMENT OF A GLOBAL & REGIONAL FRAMEWORK

Prioritise health data governance on the World Health Assembly and regional agendas, calling for the development of a global/ regional framework.

### PRIORITISE HEALTH DATA GOVERNANCE ON REGIONAL AND GLOBAL AGENDAS

Ensure health data governance prioritised as part of national, regional and global meetings and processes, to advance discussions and action.

### ENDORSE THE HEALTH DATA GOVERNANCE PRINCIPLES

Endorse the equity and rights-based principles as a foundation for stronger national legislation and regulation and a global/ regional framework.

### STRENGTHEN NATIONAL DATA GOVERNANCE FRAMEWORKS

Take steps to strengthen national health data governance legislation and regulation (the Model Law is a blueprint to support this).
